## Topics


### 1. Zooming and moving around the map

To zoom in or out of the map, use the slider at the right side of the screen.

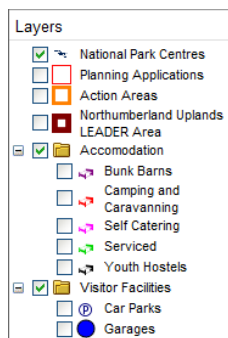


To move around the map, either click on the arrows below the slider, or click on the hand symbol at the top of the screen and drag the map around the window.



To reset the map back to the initial view, click on the zoom menu  and “select initial map view”

### 2. Viewing different map layers



To turn different layers on or off, you should tick the box next to each layer. For example to view the National Park Centres, click to place a tick in the box next to that item on the menu.

Some of the layers are grouped into folders, such as accommodation or visitor facilities. To view these layers, make sure the folder and the layer are both ticked or the layer will not display.

### 3. Search for a place or planning application

Using the search facility is straight forward. The main “search for a place” facility is displayed at the right side of the screen. You can simply type the name of a place/building/feature and then click on one of the search results and the map will take you there.

Similarly searching for a planning application is simple, just click on the “Search planning applications” link underneath the main search box, and you are able to fill in any of the search criteria you wish.

### 4. Viewing the details of something on the map.

Most of the layers will allow you to click on them and view their properties. For instance if you display the accommodation layers, clicking on one feature should display its name, address and contact details, however please note these may not be up-to-date.
